PARENT SCIENCE WORKSHOPS

We have been delighted to invite families into school on 2 occasions over the past month to take part in some fun science activities with students. There have been explosions, fizzes and lots of colours! The aim is to get families taking part in science activities who otherwise wouldn't get the chance.

MAKATON WORKSHOP

On 24th January we held a workshop to support parents in using Makaton to communicate more effectively with their children. Makaton is a form of sign language that is widely used in schools, including Hallmoor, and is used alongside spoken language and symbols to help young people understand language and express themselves. The workshop was really well attended, and all the parents joined in with Beth (who was leading the workshop) to learn a range of signs to support them in communicating simple words and phrases that they use every day.

We will be holding more Makaton workshops later in the year if other parents would like to learn more about it too.









MATHS IN REAL LIFE

KS4 are doing a 12-week programme 'Maths in Real Life, Preparing for Adulthood'.

They are going to the supermarkets on a weekly basis during timetabled maths lessons.

Students are reducing their anxieties and growing in confidence in locating products in different aisles, reading prices, gaining confidence in calculating their shopping and the shopping of others, asking for help from a shop assistant and paying accurately.

QUEEN ALEXANDRA COLLEGE VISIT

On Wednesday 5th February 2025, the students from 6MC class (Sixth Form) had the opportunity to visit Queen Alexandra College, as part of their preparation for the next step in education.

QAC is a specialist college where young adults are supported to carry on their education and to be better prepared for adult life.

Our students enjoyed exploring the college facilities. Also, they had the chance to meet some old friends who previously attended Hallmoor School.
